

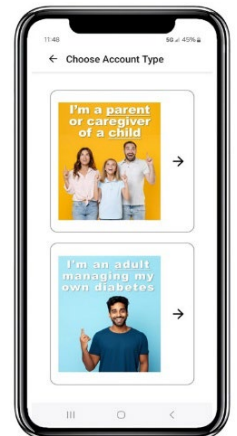
MyCareConnect Foundation Impact Report 2024

Reflecting on a Year of Growth and Gratitude

This year marked a significant milestone for Pam and me as we celebrated 20 years as proud members of the Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) community. We are filled with gratitude for the strong, supportive network that has grown around us. From parents and grandparents to siblings, school personnel, and community partners, our collective commitment ensures that our children stay safe, strong, and empowered. Our work would not be possible without the generous support of organizations that share our mission. This year, we extend our deepest thanks to **Dexcom**, **Abbott**, **Embecta** and **Diamyd** for helping us bring **BlueLoop**[®], T1D education, and support to more families and school personnel than ever before.

2024 Shared Achievements

- 1. Welcoming New BlueLoopers:** Over 3,200 new users joined the **BlueLoop**[®] family in 2024, helping them navigate their first year. Another 300 new school personnel joined us in helping students with T1D thrive.
- 2. Innovating for Adults:** This year, we introduced a new version of **BlueLoop**[®] tailored for adults with type-1 and type-2 diabetes, reflecting our commitment to inclusivity. Remarkably, about 10% of our new users are adults, highlighting the versatility and broad appeal of **BlueLoop**[®].
- 3. Educating & Advocating:** We consistently directly engage with the T1D community, spending over 800 hours on calls with families and school nurses.
- 4. Expanding our Clinical Network:** Our presence has grown with the onboarding of three new clinics across Idaho, Illinois, and Florida, a testament to the organic growth driven by positive word-of-mouth within the T1D community.
- 5. Sustained Education:** We delivered thousands of videos to both newly diagnosed families as well as our ongoing educational T1D updates to both school nurses and “**BlueLoop**[®] Graduates” who stay connected even after transitioning to pumps



Our mission is supporting the physical and emotional well-being of children with diabetes, and those who care for them.
